

AID CODE DEFINITIONS

Postsecondary

Liberal Arts

Aid Code 20 Liberal Arts

Applies to those courses which are designed as part of the Associate in Arts or Associate in Science degrees designed for direct transfer to a four year college or university.

Associate Degree

Aid Code 10 Associate Degree

Applies to those courses which are designed as part of an occupational associate degree or at the rigor of courses within associate degree programs.

Technical Diploma

Aid Code 30 Short-Term

Applies to those courses which are part of a state approved program containing at least two (2) credits but less than twenty-six (26) credits.

Aid Code 31 One-Year Technical Diploma

Applies to those courses which are part of a state approved program containing at least twenty-six (26) credits, but less than fifty-five (55) credits.

Aid Code 32 Two-Year Technical Diploma

Applies to those courses which are part of a state approved program which contain at least fifty-five (55) credits but not to exceed seventy (70) credits.

Aid Code 50 Apprentice

Applies only to apprentice courses which are part of an approved program of apprentice related instruction and/or supplemental instruction restricted to apprentices and journeyworkers.

Aid code 61 WTCS Pathway Certificate

Applies only to the State Board Recognized WTCS Pathway Certificate. Courses within the certificate bear the aid code of the Already Approved Diploma or Program.

Continuing Education

Vocational-Adult

Aid Code 42 General Adult
Applies to educational offerings which enhance citizenship and community safety for the general public.

Aid Code 47 Occupational Adult
Applies to educational offerings with a definite vocational/technical objective which are designed to either provide future employment or upgrade individuals in their present occupations.

Community Services

Aid Code 60 Adult Avocational
Applies to educational offerings that are leisure-time, self-enrichment activities including arts, crafts, games, hobbies, sports, recreation and foreign language conversation.

Non-Postsecondary

Aid Code 73 Beginning Adult Basic Education
Is used with instructional areas 850-860, 862, and 890 and applies to Adult Education courses that cover competencies in grade levels 0 – 5.9.

Aid Code 74 Intermediate Adult Basic Education
Is used with instructional areas 850-860, 862, and 890 and applies to Adult Education courses that cover competencies in grade levels 6.0 – 8.9.

Aid Code 75 English Language Learning, Hearing Impaired Program, and Visually Impaired Program
Used with instructional area 861, applies to Adult Education courses in communicating in English for learners whose native or dominant language is not English. Used with instructional area 871, applies to Hearing Impaired Program courses. Used with instructional area 872, applies to Visually Impaired Program courses.

Aid Code 76 Adult Secondary Education and Youth High School Diploma or HSED/GED Occupational
Used with instructional areas 850-860, 862, and 890, applies to Adult Education courses that cover competencies in grade levels 9.0 – 12.9. Used with occupational instructional areas, applies to occupational courses taught to school-age youth seeking to complete high school diploma or HSED/GED requirements.

Aid Code 77 Developmental
Is used with instructional areas 850-860 and applies to instruction in secondary-school level academic subjects for individuals who need to strengthen foundation competencies in order to be admitted to a postsecondary program.

Aid Code 78 Remedial

Is used with instructional areas 850-860 and applies to instruction in secondary-school level academic subjects for postsecondary program students whose deficiencies in foundation competencies were not extensive enough to deny them admission.
