

Practical Retesting Options/Instructions

If candidate fails a practical station (up to two (2) stations), they have the right to a same day retest under the following conditions:

- Same day testing is available at examination site
- Is requested by the candidate
- Approved by the NREMT Examiner Designee

Your practical examination results remain valid for one (1) year from the date of your original practical examination. If more than one (1) year elapses, all previous examination results become invalid and you must repeat the entire NREMT practical examination process.

Should you opt for a retest at another location, you must obtain advance permission from the host training center to participate in its examination. Payment of fees with any retest are the sole responsibility of the candidate. Failure to pay fees or properly register with an examination location may result in denial of entry into testing site.

Different exam sites have different types of equipment. It is your responsibility to assure you are familiar with their equipment and supplies used in the testing process.

It is your responsibility to keep records of your practical retests, remembering that it is valid for one (1) year from date of completion. Examinations that expire will require a total retest. Also, remember that you have two (2) years, from date of EMT course completion, to complete both your written and practical exams, but you must pass them both within one (1) year of each other.

It is also your responsibility to ensure you have received a copy of the Practical Examination Report Summary Form from the System Office for entry into a testing site. Those without this form will not be allowed entry. You will receive a copy of this with the your results letter.

If for some reason you need to contact the System Office for a copy of your Practical Examination Report Summary (PERS), either by phone or email, this is the information needed to receive your copy:

- 1) Full name (spell last name) speak slowly and clearly
- 2) Social Security Number
- 3) Date of Birth
- 4) Date and location you last tested

If you have moved since you last tested, be sure to include your new address. If you have a new email address, be sure to include that. The quickest way to receive copies of the PERS is by email.
