- This is the current list of WTCS systemwide general education courses included in the Associate degree curriculum. Depending on curriculum needs and resources, not all colleges will offer all systemwide courses, but it is expected that a WTCS college will accept any systemwide general education course a student may have successfully completed at another college for transfer credit.
- WTCS general education courses are reviewed annually for their continued inclusion on the WTCS list of systemwide courses.
- Students at WTCS colleges with Associate of Arts (AA) and Associate of Science (AS) degree authority: Chippewa Valley Technical College (AS degree); MATC-Madison (AA/AS degree); MATC-Milwaukee (AA/AS degree); Nicolet Area Technical College (AA/AS degree); Northwood Technical College (AA/AS degree); and Western Technical College (AS degree) also have the option of selecting comparable courses at Aid Code 20 (the 200 level courses) in lieu of these aid code 10 systemwide general education courses.
- Not all these courses transfer equally to the UW System. Courses that are listed in bold type are part of the current Universal Transfer Agreement (UCTA) with the UW System which, according to the agreement, will satisfy a general education or general degree requirement at the receiving UW or WTCS institution and may include elective credit. In addition, these courses may satisfy degree requirements differently depending on the course requirements related to the major that the student declares.
