AEFLA Comprehensive Planning amounts are determined by a formula based 40 percent on the five year estimate of American Community Survey (ACS) census counts of working age adults (18-64) in a WTCS district who did not complete high school as a percentage of all working age adults in the state who did not complete high school. Ten percent are determined on the five year average of American Community Survey (ACS) census counts of working age adults (18-64) in a WTCS district who's ability to speak English is described as "Not at all" or "Not well" as a percentage of all working age adults in the state who's ability to speak English is described as "Not at all" or "Not well". The remaining 50 percent of the formula is based on the number of the district's pre- and post-tested AEFL students completing an educational functioning level in years 2015 and 2016, and the number of the district's measurable skill gains in year 2017; funding is assigned based on the percentage of all pre- and post-tested AEFL students completing an educational functioning level and measurable skill gains across all districts over the three year period (Source: Educational Gains and Attendance for Pre- and Post-Tested Participants Report (Table 4B) and Educational gains and Attendance by Educational Functioning Level (Table 4)).
